And at first, what Jesus had to say seemed like just good, sound, everyday advice. "If you walk with your nose in the air, you're likely to fall on your face." The kind of advice we might get from Miss Manners or from mom and dad. But Jesus, in all his gentleness, had something else in mind.

People then, people now, seem to feel an itch that can't be scratched when it comes to moving up in the world: whether that world is a small family in a condo or the world of a multi-national corporation or the world of a dinner party thrown for family and friends.

That itch to stand out, to stand over, to stand above, a spouse, a neighbor or fellow employee, is an itch that has itched humanity for a very long time. And oh the price so many will pay as they try to scratch that itch. Betrayals, anger, humiliation, false pride, gossip....the list is an endless one.

The recent criminal trial of the former governor of Illinois is a rather stark example of the itch; but in truth, we are none of us immune to it. We each of us are infected to greater or lesser degrees.
